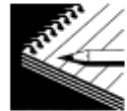

Killer Compost

“Gardeners in the United Kingdom and the United States have recently lost plants due to compost contamination with aminopyralid. It’s a chemical found in the weed killers ForeFront® and Milestone®, used to treat pastures where cattle and horses graze. The problem for gardeners is that aminopyralid doesn’t break down even if eaten and digested by an animal. As a result, some manures are laced with an unhealthy dose of broadleaf herbicide. The company that produces this chemical recommends that composted manure from animals grazing in treated fields not be sold for use in gardens. So the next time you buy manure from a local source, ask if the field where the animals grazed was treated with aminopyralid.”

Lisle is located twenty miles south of Schaumburg, where the Winter Scientific Meeting has been held in previous years. The hotel has given us a \$79.00 room rate. We have an outstanding program of speakers with interesting and timely topics:

Bob Solberg – What Ploidy Really Means to the Hosta Grower

Kevin Walek – The Hosta World from the Point of View of the Hosta Registrar – (The increasing problem with the registration of plants he does not think should be registered)

Mark Zilis – Hostas of Distinction

Again this year, the program will include a series of three concurrent breakout sessions. The topics covered in these sessions will be:

Session B: What’s New with Hydrangeas (by Dave Wanninger)

Session C: Hybridizer’s Perspective – Are Our Hostas Going to the Dogs? (by Ron Livingston)

CHANGE THE PLANT LABEL

There have been a number of hosta name changes for a variety of reasons over the years. I have chosen the following examples because these hostas are all likely to be in a number of central Illinois gardens, and in some cases labels / markers may have not yet been updated.

Non-current/Incorrect Name--

Correct Name as of 2010

-*H. montana* 'Praeflorens' -- *H. montana* f. *macrophylla*

-*H. fluctuans* 'Variegated' -- *H.* 'Sagae' or *H. fluctuans* 'Sagae'

-*H.* 'Great River Sonata' -- *H.* 'Sagae' or *H. fluctuans* 'Sagae'

'Great River Sonata' was the gift hosta for the 2004 MRHS convention in Dubuque, Iowa. This hosta was originally thought to be a white-margined sport of 'Moonlight Sonata', but due to a mistake at the tissue culture lab, all plants with this name are actually 'Sagae'.

-*H. nigrescens* 'Elatior' -- *H.* 'Elatior'

H. 'Moerheim' -- *H.* 'Antioch'

H. 'Spinners' -- *H.* 'Antioch' 'Antioch' has also been sold as 'Moerheim' and 'Spinners'.

H. venusta 'Variegated' -- *H.* 'Masquerade'
Prior to being registered as *H.* 'Masquerade' in the early 1990s, this hosta was marketed as *H. venusta* 'Variegated'.

- *H.* 'Geisha' -- *H.* 'Ani Machi' The plant Kevin Vaughn registered in 1983 as 'Geisha' is believed to no longer exist. Plant labels for the hosta widely sold as 'Geisha' should be changed to 'Ani Machi'.

H. 'J.W. Matthews' -- *H.* 'Jim Matthews'
Before being registered, this cultivar was known as 'J.W. Mathews'.

H. 'Golden Prayers' -- *H.* 'Little Aurora'
The plant sold as 'Golden Prayers' since the early 1980s is actually 'Little Aurora'.

- *H.* 'Emerald Island' -- *H.* 'Emerald Ruff Cut'
The name 'Emerald Island' introduced in the late 1990s, changed to 'Emerald Ruff Cut' when registered in 2003 to avoid any confusion with 'Emerald Isle'.

H. 'Polar Moon' -- *H.* 'Clifford's Polar Moon'
What was commonly marketed as 'Polar Moon' is actually 'Clifford's Polar Moon'.

-*H.* 'Dancing Eddy' -- *H.* 'Uzu-no-mai'

'Uzu-no-mai' is sometimes incorrectly listed under its translated (Japanese to English) name, 'Dancing Eddy'. The popularity of this cultivar, widely considered the smallest hosta, has been negatively impacted because of its difficulty to maintain and over winter.

Whether one elects or chooses not to change labels to coincide with what the American Hosta Society (AHS) considers to be the most current and correct names is a personal choice. I personally suggest following the guidance of the AHS. Those that keep track of their hostas in a spreadsheet or database may want to retain both the original and updated names.

The third issue of the *Hosta Journal* is now available on the internet and it's a beauty. The AHS needs to save some money too and they are going to have two printed issues and one on the internet.

AHS members can access the newsletter from the American Hosta Society website. All you have to do is click on the big hosta and enter a universal password and it was printed in the President's letter in the latest Journal. The colored photos are really great.

For those members who do not have a computer, please ask a friend to get them to the website, and you can print off a paper copy.
